UNIT NARRATIVE

In this unit, *La tecnología*, students will explore the integral role of technology in modern life through the lens of Spanish language and culture. They will engage in conversations about common devices, such as cell phones and computers, and describe how they use technology in their daily routines. Students will learn to talk about cars and machines using appropriate vocabulary and grammar, give and follow familiar commands, and describe personal belongings. Throughout the unit, they will also develop skills to ask and answer questions about personal relationships, linking interpersonal communication with the tools and platforms people use to stay connected.

Cultural exploration is a key focus of the unit, with students learning about the role of technology in various Spanish-speaking countries, particularly in remote areas. They will investigate how different cultures use technology, comparing these practices to their own, and examining how geography—especially in Argentina—shapes access and innovation. Students will enhance their language skills through reading borrowed words in context, identifying key vocabulary in writing, and recognizing the genre of spoken Spanish discourse through listening activities. By the end of the unit, students will be able to confidently describe and discuss how technology shapes personal and cultural experiences.
